

PROLIFE FACTS

In a victory for pro-life GPs, on 3rd December the High Court in Wellington ruled that proposed Guidelines, which would require a GP to offer an abortion to a pregnant patient should she be unhappy about the pregnancy, overstepped the law and imposed obligations beyond those imposed by law.

In 2009, the NZ Medical Council issued proposed Guidelines on abortion which indicated pressure on the right of GPs to maintain freedom of conscience.

A group of pro-life Wellington GPs discerned a future risk of disciplinary action from the Medical Council should they refuse to facilitate an abortion for a patient. They were aware that overseas, there is a growing intolerance by medical elites to allow freedom of conscience with abortion.

It should be noted that the NZ Medical Council has shown no interest in, nor commented on, the extensive research from overseas and particularly NZ, that reveals the serious consequences of abortion on many women's mental health.
