

## PROLIFE

Dr Bernard Nathanson, former abortionist and co-founder of the modern abortion-rights movement, died on 21<sup>st</sup> February aged 84. His funeral was held in New York's St Patrick's Cathedral. Nathanson's remarkable odyssey from pioneering abortion activist to pro-life leader and champion of the pre-born is chronicled in his two books "Aborting America" and "The Hand of God".

In 1967, he teamed up with journalist Lawrence Lader. Together they founded NARAL (National Association for the Repeal of Abortion Laws). They were geniuses at public relations, tapping into a wellspring of liberal support. Nathanson ran the first and largest abortion clinic in New York, later estimating that he had presided over the deaths of 75,000 human beings.

Exhausted from running the clinic, he took a sabbatical and found himself amazed at the developments in foetology. The science proved conclusively that the preborn baby at every stage is an individual human person. While still an atheist, Nathanson became weighed down with a crushing awareness of sin. He contemplated suicide, but gradually and painfully, he found himself repentant at the foot of the Cross, seeking true forgiveness.
