25 states in America have Women's Right to Know laws requiring informed consent and reflection periods before an abortion. In Louisiana, the "Signs of Hope" Act was signed in July, 2011 by Governor Bobby Jindal and is now being developed by the department of health.

The legislation requires prominent Women's Right to Know signs, featuring a web address that converts to a mobile format when it is accessed by an iPhone or mobile. Women can use their mobile phones or laptops to view photos and videos of the unborn child, information about abortion risks and adoption services, and resources where they can obtain free ultrasound and prenatal care.

The drafters of the law recognise that women today get the majority of their information via mobile technology.

The law requires the URL to be posted on the home page of abortion clinic websites and must be given to anyone scheduling an appointment for an abortion. Signs of Hope are designed for women who often feel hopeless and coerced, due to a perceived lack of alternatives.
