In Auckland this important ministry is offered through Family Life International, with the faithful support of priests and diocesan staff. Project Rachel offers retreats, support groups and individualised care. In their Chapel at the John Paul II Centre, FLI offers the 'Book of Life', in which parents can write the names of their children who died before birth or in childhood.
